<b>Can I find out about Claude Monet ,impressionist' painter.</b>	I can recall facts about the artist Monet and the Cubist movement. I can analyse works of Claude Monet as a class. I can work like an impressionist artist..	Oscar-Claude Monet was a French painter, a founder of French Impressionist painting and the most consistent practitioner of the movement's philosophy of expressing one's perceptions before nature, especially as applied to plein air landscape painting.	
<b>Can I find out how an artist with Autism can overcome obstacles to create artwork?</b>	I can work like watercolour artist Iris Grace. I understand Iris expresses herself through her art (as she doesn't communicate through voice often).	Paintings by Iris Grace, a child with an extraordinary talent to express herself through painting. She is Autistic and is only just starting to talk but is able to paint in a style far beyond her years. We wanted to share her art to raise awareness of her condition and inspire other families in similar situations to ours.	
<b>Can I add different tones using pencil and pastel?</b>	I can shade with increasing pressure to create a variety of tones.	Tonal shading is a technique used in drawing and sketching to create the illusion of form, depth, and volume on a flat surface. It involves using different shades of a single colour to add dimension and realism to the drawing.	
<b>Can I create a relief using collage?</b>	I can manipulate paper to make Lilies.	'Collage'- French for 'to glue' or 'to stick'.	
<b>Can I use watercolour and wax resist?</b>	I can draw flowers with wax and apply watercolour wash to reveal sketches.	Coloured wax crayons or white wax candles are used in this technique which is based on the fact that wax repels water. Strokes are made with clear wax then overpainted with watercolour. The wash only adheres to the paper where there is no wax.	
<b>End of Unit Assessment:</b>	Children put on an exhibition for the local community and leave feedback forms. Revisit and read what members of the public think of our Art display.
