- Sheffield is a city in the county of South Yorkshire.
- South Yorkshire boarders: Derbyshire, Nottinghamshire, North Yorkshire, Lincolnshire, East Riding of Yorkshire and West Yorkshire.
- Sheffield is built on 7 hills and around five rivers: the Don and its four main tributaries: the rivers Loxley, Rivelin, Sheaf and Porter.
- In Sheffield, land is used for retail, leisure, housing, business, Industry and agriculture.
- The Peak District National Park is used for farming, to supply water, quarrying and tourism.
- The area has two main parts. The northern 'Dark Peak' is where most of the moorland is found. Its geology is gritstone. The southern 'White Peak' is where most of the population lives: its geology is mainly limestone.







- Volcanoes are caused when magma rises to the surface of the Earth, which causes bubbles of gas to appear in it. This gas can cause pressure to build up in the mountain, and it eventually explodes.
- Earthquakes are usually caused when rock underground suddenly breaks along a fault. This sudden release of energy causes the seismic waves that make the ground shake.
- A tsunami is a series of large waves generated by an abrupt movement on the ocean floor that can result from an earthquake, an underwater landslide, a volcanic eruption or - very rarely - a large meteorite strike.
- Most volcanoes happen on fault lines, or cracks in the Earth's surface.
- Most of the Earth's volcanoes are in the Pacific Ocean, in an area called the Ring of Fire
- People choose to live close to active volcanoes because:
 - Soil near volcanoes is often good for growing crops.
 - Geothermal can be harnessed.
- Scientists use seismic waves to measure how big an earthquake is. They use a scale
 called the Moment Magnitude Scale or MMS (it used to be called the Richter scale).




VOLCANO STRUCTURE
